DEVELOPING LEADERSHIP

My own daughters owe much of their public speaking poise, commitment to justice and leadership skills to growing up at CCSM. Of course, we had some challenging moments—like when my then-three-year-old forgot to wear her underpants and then sat up front for the Children's Message with her knees too many inches apart! No one noticed, but we parents were certainly cringing.

Launching this summer, CCSM will formalize a spiritual leadership program for our youth, offering them opportunities beyond those available for the younger children. As a kick-off, they will attend the Western Regional Youth Event hosted by the Hawaii Conference to meet youth from other UCC churches. Then, throughout the year they will participate in service and justice activities, volunteer at church events, and more. Hopefully surrounded by a community of love and support, these young people will grow in their faith and commitment while also learning to be good citizens of the world.
