

### IN PLAIN SIGHT

For the past year I have convened a group of clergy now called the Anti-Trafficking Faith Leaders Coalition. One of our goals is to raise awareness about human trafficking in San Mateo County. On January 11, our worship service will be lifting up the issue of human trafficking, and that afternoon CCSM will also be the venue for a big event sponsored by a number of faith, non-profit and civic organizations. I hope a number of CCSM people will come out and learn more about this important justice issue.

I am also pleased to report that we were awarded a \$5,000 grant from Silicon Valley Community Foundation to help fund this event. Bonnie Rambob has been working on this with me.



#### EXTRAVAGANT WELCOME APPRECIATED

The November 30 worship service featured experiences from eight CCSM members who visited immigrant communities around the county. What a special day of touching stories and delightful music! Afterwards our visitors from Half Moon Bay repeatedly commented on the warm acceptance and comfort they felt among us. Thanks to each of you, CCSM truly embodied "no matter who you are... you are welcome here."

To our visitors' surprise later, they received two-thirds of your generous offering that Sunday (half of that two-thirds for ALAS, the children's performance group, and half for the mural in memory of Yanira Serrano-Garcia). Belinda Hernandez Arriaga, our coastside liaison and director of ALAS, wrote:

"Thank you so much! We were very touched and moved by the entire service and congregation. It was amazing and we are still inspired and reenergized by all of YOU! And your gift to our efforts! That is wonderful.

"We have a young girl whose father left to Mexico to go and see his mother who was very ill, and it turns out that he can't return as he thought because he has gotten detained at the border trying to cross now three times. So the mom and her three

children have been here struggling alone. ALAS has been there for them, so it's been a gift that they have been in our program and vice versa. But they can't pay for their class or costumes or anything, so your gift will go to support them for this year.

"Also, we have a new girl who just arrived from Mexico—a wonderful young girl. She is having a hard time in school as she doesn't know English, but she danced ballet folklorico in Mexico. Now she is coming to our ALAS Ballet Folklorico class and so feels connected to home. Thank you so much! So it will be great to be able to support her as well.

"Also—the gift for the mural [honoring Yanira]. That is amazing, and we so appreciate it. This money will go directly to the artist Ernesto Olmos.

"What a blessing you all are to us!"

#### **ALL CHURCH CAROLING**


