SENTENCING REFORM IN CALIFORNIA SUNDAY, MAY 1, AFTER CHURCH • BUCKHAM ROOM

Criminal felony sentencing in California has undergone so many significant changes during the last five years, the reforms can be hard to understand. After church grab your coffee and move to the Buckham Room to hear our own Jon Karesh, a San Mateo County Superior Court judge, expertly talk us through these changes as well as the benefits and drawbacks of these reforms. First "realignment" in 2011, in which sentences for many felonies are now served in the local county jail instead of state prison; then the reform of the Three Strikes law in 2012; and most recently Proposition 47 in 2014, which reclassified many felony theft and drug offenses as misdemeanors.

Jon Karesh was born and raised in San Francisco. He went to college and law school at UC Berkeley. After working for a time in a large downtown San Francisco law firm, Jon moved to San Mateo County to take a job as a deputy district attorney. After serving as a deputy district attorney for more than 12 years, he was appointed to the position of San Mateo County Superior Court Judge in 2001. Since taking the bench, Jon has tried close to 100 criminal and civil jury trials. Jon has been a member of CCSM since 2007.



FROM CHARITY TO ADVOCACY AND DEEP SOLIDARITY

GUEST PREACHER DR. JOERG RIEGER SUNDAY, APRIL 17

Join us on April 17 for our special guest preacher, Dr. Joerg Rieger, Professor of Constructive Theology at Perkins School of Theology, SMU. He received his MDiv in Germany, his ThM from Duke Divinity School, and his PhD from Duke University.

For more than two decades he has worked to bring together theology and the struggles for justice and liberation that mark our age. His work addresses the

relation of theology and public life, reflecting on the misuse of power in religion, politics, and economics. His main interest is in movements and developments that bring about change and the positive contributions of religion and theology.

Author and editor of more than 20 books and over 125 articles, his most recent book is *Faith on the Road: A Short Theology of Travel and Justice* (2015). Rieger and his wife, organizer Rosemarie Henkel-Rieger, have co-authored *Unified We are a Force: Growing Deep Solidarity between Faith and Labor*, forthcoming from Chalice Press in April.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On Saturday, April 30th from 4-7pm, CCSM will be hosting a Town Hall Meeting/Community Event for our

neighbors in North Central San Mateo. One of the main objectives of this event is to gather people who are being affected by the high cost of living in San Mateo, but haven't had the space to voice their struggles or know where to join others in the struggle. Many people may feel alone as they experience high rent increases,

so we are hoping to create a space not only to have their voices heard but to hear each other, and hopefully realize they are not alone. In this past year I have participated in public meetings hosted by the San Mateo City Council to discuss the housing crisis, with the goal of hearing stories from the people about steep rent increases. Too often the voices of the Latin@ community are not heard, or the Latin@ community struggles to fully understand what is being said because of the language barrier. Often they end up checking out when they are given the opportunity to share their voice, because they feel they are not smart enough, or not capable of articulating their struggle, or believing that their voice really can make a difference. They usually want to refer someone who is "educated" or white, those who "have more power," to speak for them.

At our own Housing meeting on the 30th we want to create a space that will empower and help our Latin@ neighbors to start believing in the authority of their voice, and to articulate their ideas rather than deferring to "professionals" or "educated" folks to do that for them. Our hope is that by providing this space people would come out of the woodwork and be empowered to find their own voice. And we hope that by providing the space to do this they can feel like CCSM is paying attention, creating together an agenda for equality and true partnership with one another.

I hope many of you are able to attend the event to observe and witness a community coming together that is too often not given a space to do so. Equally important, come out that night and have tacos and share a meal with the neighbors. I look forward to seeing you there.
